



A level - Conservation Worksheet

In this worksheet, we'll devise an outline of a conservation program for a crocodilian species.

When selecting a species for conservation, what factors do you think we need to consider?

Look at: the IUCN Red List at <u>http://www.iucnredlist.org/</u> and search for that species of crocodile to see detailed information on its conservation status.

In the species Action Plans, you can read about your selected crocodile species. The end of each Action Plan outlines the conservation priorities for that species. Read through these and list the priorities for your species:

It is very difficult for one project to address all of the conservation priorities. So, which of the priority actions do you think your project should address?

Since we are a zoo, we not only support some of these actions for the animals in the wild (*in situ*), but we also run programs for the species within the zoo community (*ex situ*). Do you think a zoo can run an *ex situ* program for the species you have selected?
